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



# AN INSIDER'S GUIDE TO LOWCOUNTRY

Strolling through the cobblestone streets of Charleston, SC in the fall is like having access to the best kept secret in the south. Pleasantly warm with temperatures averaging 75-to-83-degrees, visiting Charleston in the off season is a great way to save money while taking in the southern fried hospitality. Charleston isn't just a city full of waterfront charm; it's a history lesson told through architecture, location and tradition. Fort Sumter, where the first shots of the Civil War rang out, is worth boating to. Catfish Row, Rainbow Row and the Charleston City Market are all worth visiting. Yet, no trip to the Lowcountry would be complete without including the Gullah people with their native dialect, a mix of West African, French and Creole. Their handwoven seagrass baskets are a treasured American artform dating back 300 years. For this issue, we list our favorite Charleston things to see, places to go and food to eat.

### House & Garden Tours

From October 4-28, historic mansions from The Battery to King Street open their doors to allow ticketholders in. Hosted by the Preservation Society of

Charleston, The Fall Tours highlight the homes, history and architecture of this lovely port city. From 2-5 p.m., multiple homeowners across the city give

us a glimpse into their private homes. These are not museums. Families reside in and protect these 18th century architecturally significant homes and for about \$50 per tour, you get to see how the other half lives.

### Cabbage Row

Now called "Catfish Row" these historic homes showcase architecture dating back to the Revolutionary War. Home to industrious freed slaves who sold the cabbage they grew in the courtyard right from their front window sills, these structures are also the setting of where George Gershwin's opera, *Porgy & Bess*, takes place. 89-91 Church Street, Charleston, SC

## Rainbow Row

Blighted after the Civil War, this waterfront property dating back 1748 to 1845 can be found on East Bay Street. Once the home of city merchants, the live/work structures were abandoned during wartime. Then came Dorothy Porcher Legge, a local woman who purchased some of the derelict houses, restored them, and painted them pastel pink. Others followed and painted their homes in various pastel shades. Now, the 14 pastel painted homes are commonly known as Rainbow Row. It is the longest cluster of Georgian row houses in the country and offers the perfect backdrop for selfies and location tagging. *83 East Bay Street, Charleston, SC.*

## Carolina Gold Rice

The grandfather of long-grain rice in America, Carolina Gold Rice was a commercial staple grain in 1685 influencing Lowcountry cuisine. Because of Carolina Gold, Charleston became the leading rice producer in the U.S. for 200 years, and a wealthy city. Anson Mills Middlins Rice is the variety locals prefer. Head to Poogan's Porch, the oldest independent restaurant in Charleston, featuring this variety on its dinner menu. Tucked away in a Victorian house at 72 Queen Street, Poogan's Porch offers Sweet Tea Glazed Salmon and Roasted Duck Pirloo, both



featuring the rice. To take home a two-pound bag of Carolina Gold, the long grain variety, head to the Charleston City Market. It's about \$15. *188 Meeting Street, Charleston, SC.*

## The Angel Oak

Standing 65-feet tall, the Angel Oak tree in Charleston is said to be one of the longest-living organisms east of the Mississippi River. Estimated to be more than 500 years old, this live oak has survived hurricanes, floods and earthquakes and still it rises. Now the property of the city and open to the public for climbing, viewing and dreaming. *3688 Angel Oak Road, Johns Island, SC.*

## The Ironwork of Charleston

Charleston is home to more than 500 pieces of ornamental wrought iron gates, window grates, balconies and fences; all created by one artisan blacksmith: Philip Simmons. Awarded the National Heritage Fellowship by the National Endowment for the Arts, Simmons' work can also be found in the Smithsonian Institute. But why travel to Washington when you can walk the streets of Charleston and behold his craft everywhere. Simmons died at age 97 in 2009, but his work lives on. Visit his home studio and see remnants of past projects and tools. *30 1/2 Blake Street, Charleston, SC.*



## MATZO BALL SOUP

# Not just for Rosh Hashanah

## Ingredients

- 1 Box** (10 ounces) matzo crackers
- ½ cup** vegetable oil or chicken schmaltz
- 1 Teaspoon** Kosher salt
- ½ Teaspoon** freshly ground white pepper
- 4 Tablespoons** minced fresh parsley
- 2 Tablespoons** chopped fresh dill
- 1 medium** sized minced onion
- 2-3 ounces** matzo meal
- 2 gallons** of homemade poultry broth
- 1 bottle** seltzer water
- 5 pounds** combination of chicken feet, necks and turkey necks, giblets, and bones
- 1 onion
- 2 carrots (peeled)
- 1 celery stalk
- 1 clove** garlic
- 3-4 black peppercorns
- 1 bay leaf
- 3 sprigs** fresh parsley
- 2 sprigs** fresh thyme

## Directions

**To make the broth:** Start with 5 quarts of cold water to extract as much collagen and flavor as possible. Add all ingredients. Simmer six to eight hours. Do not boil. Continuously skim the fatty scum from the top and add water to make sure all ingredients are covered. To keep Kosher, use the skimmed fat, or “chicken schmaltz” to mix matzo balls. Remove all meat, bones and vegetables. Strain stock using cheesecloth. Add meat from the necks back to the broth. Bring to a boil and add salt to taste.

**To make the matzo balls:** Pulverize matzo crackers in food processor. In a large bowl, dump matzo and cover with seltzer water. Let soak until matzo is soft. Drain completely. Brown matzo in chicken schmaltz or vegetable oil. Remove from pan. Mix with minced onion, salt, pepper, and parsley. Oil your hands and start rolling matzo balls as large or small as you desire. Add matzo balls to boiling broth. They will sink to the bottom then float after several minutes. Slow boil for about 20 minutes. Serve soup with fresh dill. Enjoy!

Turmeric is a natural wonder heralded for its anti-inflammatory and antioxidant properties. Golden yellow, long used as an Ayurvedic treatment, it's said to promote healthy skin and enhance your mood. To fight fine lines and wrinkles, try a cup of our Turmeric Tea. It's an inexpensive beauty treatment that tastes good too.

### Ingredients

**1 cup** unsweetened almond milk

**1 Teaspoon** freshly ground turmeric

**¼ Teaspoon** Freshly grated ginger

**½ Teaspoon** pure vanilla extract

1 Cinnamon stick

**1 Teaspoon** honey

Freshly ground black pepper

1-2 cardamom pods

### Directions

Grind turmeric in your spice grinder. Peel and grate ginger. Add both to almond milk and heat with honey and cinnamon stick until well combined and little bubbles start to form. It should be steaming hot, not boiling. Allow to heat below a simmer for 10 minutes stirring occasionally.

Strain using a fine mesh strainer. Return to pot, add vanilla and more honey, if desired. Serve in a mug and top with a cardamom pod and a dash of fresh black pepper. Enjoy.

# FABULOUS **FAUX GRANITE**

Granite paint is emerging as a popular option for painting over concrete surfaces. It's designed to mimic the look of natural granite – hence the name – and it's an ideal choice for anyone going for a natural look.

If you're worried about budgeting for new granite countertops, consider a granite paint alternative instead. It's a cost-effective option if you're renovating your kitchen and can improve the look of any solid surface countertops. There are also a wide variety of color schemes and options to create a granite appearance for a fraction of the cost.

There are plenty of things you need to know about granite paint before applying it around your home. The first fact worth noting might be the most important: granite paint is permanent. Once it's applied, granite


paint can be difficult to remove and isn't an easy texture to paint over.

While granite paint isn't easy to remove, applying it doesn't take much time or effort. It can be administered in a similar fashion as standard wall paint using brushes or rollers. Drying times are on par with regular emulsion.

The best use for granite paint is over smooth, dry surfaces. It's a smart choice for your living room or bathroom walls and will accomplish the grainy look you're going for while also providing a contemporary and natural feel to the room. Granite paint can cover up any flaws on your wall and a matt finish will effectively conceal any blemishes.

Avoid using granite paint in your bathroom, particularly in a freestanding shower. Since the paint isn't water-resistant, the frequent moisture will eventually leave a mark on your walls. It won't take long for the paint to absorb water and begin to peel.

Granite paint also isn't the best choice to apply on porous materials



because it can clog within the pores and cracks and produce a blotchy finish. High traffic areas also aren't the best location for granite paint, since it can easily crumble after too much exposure.

Most home improvement stores also sell specialty granite flakes that can be added to a base paint color. These flakes can provide an extra flair to your design.

Granite paint can accentuate the overall design of a room. It's a flexible choice for any renovation project and can bring value to a home if applied properly. It's modern, gritty and sets the tone for any earth-based design plan.

# THE GIFT OF HOME

We've all heard those stories about the down on his luck guy who landed a cash windfall through a generous Go Fund Me campaign. Stories of products that came to market because of Kickstarter make us all think we can be entrepreneurs. Leveraging the largesse of others is no longer just for tech startups or hard luck cases. Now, first time home buyers are increasingly turning to the contributions of others to help them become homeowners. Forget the expensive wedding or far flung honeymoon that costs a fortune. More young people are opting instead to ask their parents, grandparents and other loved ones to chip in on their down payment for home.

Between pooling gift funds for a government backed FHA loan, or tapping online real estate crowdfunding sites like Feather the Nest, Honey Fund and Home Fund Me, people are getting resourceful and for good reason. First time home buyers report saving for the down payment is the biggest hurdle to homeownership, according to the National Association of Realtors (NAR). In fact, one out of every three first time home buyers said it takes two years or more to save for a down payment, according to NAR. With student loan debt skyrocketing, incomes failing to keep pace and record high monthly rents, many potential home buyers feel stuck. But there's an app for that!

Most young people are sitting on an untapped resource – their social networks. Between their Instagram followers and Facebook friends, many people have a network of individuals who want to see them prosper. Your good friends want the best for you and they're usually willing to shell out big bucks for those milestones in life. How about, instead of a baby shower registry, start a future home registry?





### Ask for money

Of course, we're not advocating that you call everyone up and ask for \$20,000, but new technology allows potential homebuyers to post a profile, set a goal and watch as their network chips in. It's called crowdfunding the down payment and it's legal.

Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac, the quasi-governmental bodies that buy mortgages to provide market liquidity, has approved Home Fund Me as a down payment source. With this app, you post your photos, videos and goal then wait for cousins, aunts, uncles and friends to pitch in. Likewise, Feather the Nest, helps people fund their down payment, or their wedding, honeymoon or home repairs. This micro-gifting is a way for people to ask for cash without the embarrassment. Besides, most people already have a toaster, a blender and other small appliances, what they need, and want, is a house.



### Not tech savvy?

For some, posting a campaign to raise money for your dream home can seem off-putting. If your Facebook friends are actually frenemies, you're not going to raise much cash. Another option: mom and dad. Honestly, any relative, fiancé or domestic partner can gift you a down payment as long as they aren't affiliated with the builder, developer or any other vested party to the transaction. That means, your parents, grandparents or distant cousins can give you 100 percent of your down payment! There are rules. The donor must sign a gift letter specifying the dollar amount given, the date the funds were transferred and that they don't expect the money back.

Most lenders will ask for bank statements to document that the seller has enough money to make the gift and that you actually deposited that exact amount in your account. Remember, lenders always ask for at least two months of income verification. If it's taking a long time for you to find a house and the gift money was deposited four months ago, that's considered "seasoned" and it may not raise any lender concerns.



### Percentage woes

Of course, a 20 percent down payment is ideal, but it's not necessary. Last year, most first-time home buyers put down about six percent, according to Down Payment Resource, a service that tracks down payment assistance grants nationwide. Think about this, the median price of house was \$245,500 in the first quarter of the year, according to NAR. If you're able to raise just six percent (\$14,730) from friends and family, you could turn in your lease for a mortgage in no time.


Watching the sunrise in Yosemite was one of the most beautiful experiences. Watching as the light crept slowly through the valley was mesmerizing.




